ABOUT THE ARTISTS

Meko Cheng

Department of Fine Arts, Hong Kong Art School & RMIT University

Meko Cheng is fascinated by the relationship between materials, weight and physical manifestation. Inspired by Japanese traditional architecture and interior design, she creates artworks with paper and space. Meko's works often show a state of balance and imbalance by suspending paper in the air which also reflects her emotion at the time.

Lily Leung

Department of Fine Arts, Hong Kong Art School & RMIT University

With a background of working as a fashion model and in advertising campaigns, Lily Leung is a self-taught photographer turned artist. Lily embraces history, literature, feminism and life, her choice of images are poetic and ingenuous. She works with photography, video and installation. Her graduation artwork "Eileen Chang: Tierce of Life" combines Chinese literature and art presentation with western technique, creates a new perspective to the audience.

<u>Li Ning</u>

Department of Fine Arts, Hong Kong Art School & RMIT University

Li Ning is a tattoo artist as well as a visual artist that works with paintings, block prints and videos. He is a storyteller and present his stories by block prints and

video. He welcomes the audience to follow his story line or to interpret by themselves with imagination.

<u>Liao Jiaming</u>

School of Creative Media, City University of Hong Kong

Graduated from Master of Fine Art in Creative Media from City University of Hong Kong, Liao Jiaming uses photograph, video and installation in his art practice. He explores and elaborates on topics of urban life, minority groups and living space with his artworks. Liao Jiaming's works have been exhibited or screened in Hong Kong, Shanghai, London, Zurich and other cities.

<u>Ticko</u>

Academy of Visual Art, Hong Kong Baptist University

Ticko Liu is a dedicated painter who would like to share his life experience to the audience. His paintings are vivid and intriguing, instead of telling a story he is trying to freeze a moment of his personal experience and present it through the works. Ticko's paintings are like a twisted, dramatic and surrealistic version of a Polaroid, capturing a special moment in a special location with a special emotion to share with everyone.

Lui Koon To, Kyle School of Creative Media, City University of Hong Kong

Lui Koon To Kyle believes "Life is a journey, time is a ship" and he tries to present "time" in his artworks. Although "time" is invisible but by using his self-made flipping machine, "time" is visualized with the slowly moving images of light and shadow. The mechanical movement mimics our repetitive daily life while time is running without us noticing.

<u>WaiWai</u>

School of Creative Media, City University of Hong Kong

WaiWai graduated from City University of Hong Kong with a Bachelor of Arts from the School of Creative Media. WaiWai seeks to communicate with people through her artwork, with heart and mind. She believes the influence people have on one another is very powerful and that a person's mindset and thoughts are more important than anything else. Looking at the city around her, WaiWai turns to her nostalgia for Hong Kong's rapidly changing cityscape for her inspiration.

Jacky Wong

Academy of Visual Art, Hong Kong Baptist University

Jacky Wong's paintings are often inspired by the connection between people and the society. He creates his own stories as a reflection of certain society issues in Hong Kong, "I create stories, I create lies, to tell the truth." says the artist. Jacky also believes there are social responsibilities of being an artist and he is exploring his way in this particular direction.

<u>Yim Kei Tung</u>

Department of Fine Arts, Chinese University of Hong Kong

Yim Kei Tung focuses on installation art. He started to study the relationship between the city and himself after his participation in an exchange program in Beijing Tsinghua University. He concentrates on mesmerizing relationship between exploring the rhythm of a human body and the rhythm of the city. His artworks includes video, installation and performance.
